

District 4 SkillsUSA Competition Regulations

Revised10 - 2018

PURPOSE

Our purpose is to promote leadership and trade excellence in a competitive situation and give SkillsUSA Texas Student members an opportunity to demonstrate the basic skills of their field. District competitions determine the eligibility of a student to compete at the state level of SkillsUSA.

All contestants should refer to the General regulations found in the National Technical Standards.

Competitions

Contests listed and approved for SkillsUSA members in the SkillsUSA TECHNICAL STANDARDS should be conducted at the District level as closely to national standards as possible. Contests listed in the Texas Regulations are those that are held only in the SkillsUSA Texas SkillsUSA Texas SkillsUSA Texas Championships and Conference and Conference and will advance to the state level.

- A contest will be provided, when two or more district chapters register for a competition.
- If only one district chapter registers for a competition that competitor must be evaluated at the district conference to be eligible to represent the district at the SkillsUSA Texas SkillsUSA Texas Championships and Conference and Conference.
- Advisors may enter five members for each individual skill contest..
- Advisors may enter two members for each individual leadership
- **Advisors may enter one team in a team competition**

District 4 Delegate Meeting

Each Texas chapter will have one delegate plus one delegate for each group of 10 or major fraction of 10.
i.e. 16 members = 3 voting delegates 15 members = 2 voting delegates
Delegates are required to wear their delegate ribbon to be able to vote

Substitutions

Leadership Development and Technical Skilled Competitions – Substitutions may be made for individual competitions no later than 2 days prior to posted district registration pickup at the conference or 2 days prior to a competition being held before official conference dates. This must be completed with the online substitution form and emailed to your district director. Substitutions may not be made on site.

Team Events: Advisors will notify the district director if a qualified contestant is unable to attend no later than 1 week before competition. No more than 50% of a team may be substituted. Substitutions may be made for any member of a team provided the substitute:

1. Was a paid SkillsUSA member by the state deadline
2. Paid a district registration fee
3. Is a member of the local chapter entering the contest.

Job Exhibits

Refer to the Student Job Exhibit General Rules in the Texas Regulations. Each student may enter one individual job exhibit. Refer to Texas Regulation for correct grade sheet to ensure your job exhibit is placed and graded appropriately.

SkillsUSA Texas District IV is not responsible for the loss or damages to any job exhibit.

SkillsUSA Texas District IV is not responsible for setting your project in the correct area.

Be sure to follow instructions at the competition to ensure your project is graded correctly with correct grade sheet.

Grievance

The SkillsUSA Texas District IV Teacher Advisor will chair the Grievance committee at the SkillsUSA Texas District IV Contest. they will pick two SkillsUSA Texas Advisors to serve with them.

- a. The advisor must submit in writing the rule from the Technical Standard or the Texas Regulations that was not followed.
- b. Action will then be taken on any suggestion for improvement or resolution properly presented to the SkillsUSA Texas District IV Grievance Committee.
- c. Upon evaluation of the grievance report, the SkillsUSA Texas District IV Grievance Committee will notify the teacher filing the report of the actions taken.
- d. All Grievances will be filed at scheduled times.
